 - Folding desk project during COVID (500 desks built)





We are Not for Profit

- An outreach mission of St. Mark's Episcopal Church -501(c)(3)
- Where does the money go?
 - Travel and living expenses for work teams
 - Airfare
 - Van rental, gasoline
 - Groceries
 - Lodging expenses
 - Materials for building projects
 - Sponsoring a Blitz build costs \$25,000 or more per home!

99.9% of funds collected directly fund projects

Annual Project Selection Process

- Fall: Leadership team identifies candidate locations
- Winter:
 - "Scouting" teams travel to any new locations
 - Scouting teams present to leadership team and make recommendations

Locations we consider:

- Disaster relief regions
- Impoverished areas
- Local needs (ARC home renovation, Ellicott City flood recovery, military family home renovation, etc.)

January, 2024 Puerto Rico Trip

- 17 missioners traveled to San Juan
- Worked on 4 buildings
- Worked with SBP, Apoyemos (One Hand)



Typical Mission Trip

- Sunday: Travel, settle in at volunteer center, safety talks, etc.
- Monday Friday
 - Work days, typically 7:30 AM 4:00 PM, except half day on Wednesday
 - Evening worship & fun activities which depend on location
- Saturday: Cleanup, travel home








Hazard, KY Flood


- July, 2022
- 49 people lost their lives
- Over 600 people rescued
- 1,600 homes damaged or destroyed






















Blitz Build

- Begin 1st day with block foundation
- Four days later...





- We CAN bring our own tools
- Last year, we built 2 homes with a team of 23 volunteers

Our Blitz Goal for 2024

- This year, our goal is to build three homes with a team of 36 volunteers
- The cost of a house sponsorship is \$25,000
- We have raised \$50,000 so far, but we need to raise more to take on the 3rd house
- Look for fund raising opportunities (dining out at local restaurants, etc.) and support us!
- If you have ideas for fund-raising, please let us know!

Platinum Level \$10,000 Gold Level \$5,000 Silver Level \$1,000

Each Kentucky blitz build costs DreamBuilders \$25,000
In June 2023, DreamBuilders built 2 homes at a cost of \$50,000
DreamBuilders' 2024 goal is to build 3 homes

- Day 1:
 - Meet at Temple Isaiah
 - Drive to Hazard (8 hour drive)
 - Settle in to living quarters
- Day 2-5:
 - Blitz build (work day from 7:00 3:30)
 - Evening free time/dinner/services
- Day 6:
 - Day of relaxation and fun (allegedly)
- Day 7:
 - Pack up/clean up
 - Return to Temple Isaiah


NOTE: If you would like to join us, but can't afford the \$700 fee, please let us know. We have scholarship funds available.


